The school is organising the **School-Level Cooking with Fire Competition** under the **CBSE Young India Culinary Championship (YICC) 2026-27** on Friday, July 24, 2026.

This competition provides an excellent opportunity to showcase your creativity, culinary skills and awareness of healthy eating.

Competition Details

Date: 24 July 2026

Time Limit: 90 minutes (Preparation and Presentation)

Participation: Individual

- Participants shall prepare one main course dish only from any one of the following cuisines:
 - Modern Western
 - Asian
 - Indian
- Use of non-vegetarian food item is strictly prohibited.
- Participants must prepare two portions of the dish with appropriate garnishing: a. One plate for display b. One plate for judging
- Shared facilities provided: a. Burners b. Worktable c. Sink d. Cooking unit/Oven 5. Competition time: 90 minutes (Preparation and presentation)

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Participation is open only to regular students of schools affiliated with CBSE.
- Participants will compete individually at school level.
- Submission of the nomination form implies acceptance of all competition rules and terms.
- A hard copy of the recipe must be submitted along with the nomination form.
- The nomination form must carry No Objection Certificate (NOC) or consent form duly signed by parent/guardian.
- Contestants must report and present their dishes according to the allotted time schedule. Late presentations may lead to disqualification.
- Participants must bring their own raw materials, display items, utensils and any special equipment (if required).

- Participants are responsible for maintaining cleanliness, waste collection and proper disposal. Hygiene standards will be assessed.
- Semi-cooked or semi-finished products are not permitted. Use of banned ingredients will result in disqualification.
- Proper school uniform along with apron/chef coat and head cover must be worn as per the guidelines. The judgement process shall be conducted fairly, transparently and without bias by a panel of competent teachers and their decision shall be final and binding.

Judgement Criteria

Participants will be assessed on:

- Taste, flavour and aroma
- Texture and presentation
- Hygiene and food safety
- Nutritional value and ingredient selection
- Creativity and originality
- Workplace organisation and waste management

Selection of Winners

The top two students from the school-level competition will be selected to represent the school as a team at the CBSE Regional Level Competition. If the team qualifies at the Regional Level, it will advance to the CBSE National Level Competition, where students will compete with the best teams from across the country.

Selected participants will also have the opportunity to attend workshops and orientation sessions conducted by professional chefs, focusing on nutrition, kitchen hygiene, food sustainability, plating and presentation, and gaining valuable exposure to the hospitality and culinary industries.
